**CRITERIA FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENT GRANTS**

Maricopa Grants made to high schools students attending Maricopa Community Colleges in dual enrollment programs must follow these criteria. High school students not in dual enrollment programs may apply for financial aid through the regular Maricopa Grant Program criteria.

1. Student recipients must demonstrate "financial need" by completing the Dual Enrollment Grant Application Form and providing documentation of household income using the most recent years signed income tax return for the student and the parent or guardians. The need for financial assistance will be indicated if household income falls within the Maricopa Grant Eligibility Guidelines.
2. Student recipients from households that do not file income tax returns may demonstrate financial need if they provide documentation that, they, their parents, or a household member receives benefits from any of the following federal benefits program: Supplemental Social Security, Food Stamps, TANF, AHCCCS or WIC.
3. The student is an Arizona resident or has lawful immigration status, such as permanent residents or refugee status, consistent with eligibility requirements for FASFA. The student must document legal residency status or lawful immigrant status in accordance with Proposition 300. The student must be classified as a resident for tuition purposes; Exception: Refugees classified as nonresidents are eligible for funding.
4. A grant award may be applied toward resident tuition and registration fees in dual enrollment courses only, and will cover a maximum of twelve credit hours per student per year. Students are responsible for all other fees and charges. Students must complete the first semester in which they enroll with a grade of A, B, or C in order to receive financial assistance for the following semester. Withdrawal from a course funded by a Dual Enrollment Grant after the last date for Official Course Withdrawal will disqualify a student for any additional grant awards while in high school. A disqualified student may request reconsideration for financial aid based on extenuating circumstances. The award of additional aid will be at the college's discretion.

## MARICOPA COMMUNITY COLLEGES Dual Enrollment Tuition Assistance Program

The Dual Enrollment Tuition Assistance program is offered for Arizona high school students attending Maricopa Community Colleges in dual enrollment programs.

Student recipients must demonstrate “financial need” by completing the MARICOPA GRANT APPLICATION FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS and providing documentation of household income using the most recent year’s signed income tax return for the parent or guardians. Financial need will be indicated if household income & family size meets the eligibility requirements of the Maricopa Grant for Dual Enrollment Eligibility Guidelines.

### Additional Eligibility Requirements

1. Under Arizona state law, a person who is not a United States citizen or who is without lawful immigration status may not receive tuition assistance through this program.
2. Tuition assistance may be applied toward resident tuition and registration fees in dual enrollment courses only. Students are responsible for all other fees and charges.
3. Tuition assistance will cover a maximum of eight credit hours per student per year for all Maricopa Community College dual enrollment courses.
4. Students must complete the first semester in which they enroll with a grade of A, B, or C in order to receive tuition assistance for the following semester.
5. Withdrawal from a course funded by the Dual Enrollment Tuition Assistance program after the last date for Official Course Withdrawal will disqualify a student for any additional tuition assistance while in high school.
6. A disqualified student may request reconsideration based on documented extenuating circumstances. Consideration regarding extenuating circumstances is approved or denied at the college’s discretion.
