

Equity in Athletics Report - Paradise Valley Community College

Academic Year 2017-2018

(Pursuant to 20 USC §1092(g))

I. Enrollment:

In the prior academic year, the college enrolled 5,426 full-time male students and 6,750 full-time female students. Of these students, 104 male students were participants on at least one intercollegiate athletics team, and 64 female students were participants on at least one intercollegiate athletics team. Of the 168 student-athletes at PVCC, there were 16 who participated on more than one team; 12 male (12 XC/TF) and 4 female (3 XC/TF; 1 Soc/Ten).

II. Expenses:

The amount of total expenses for all teams was \$780,656.

The amount of expenses incurred from men's sports combined was \$215,350. Of this amount, the amount of expenses incurred from football was \$0 (PVCC does not host football). The amount of expenses incurred from men's basketball was \$0 (PVCC does not host men's basketball).

The amount of expenses incurred from women's sports combined was \$194,355. The amount of expenses incurred from women's basketball was \$0 (PVCC does not host women's basketball).

III. Sports:

A. **Baseball:** There were 29 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$78,356. The head coach was male, and served as a full-time employee. Additionally, there were 5 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 5 were male; none of them were full-time, all were part-time.

- B. **Men's Cross Country:** There were 16 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$43,427. The head coach was male, and served as a full-time employee. Additionally, there was 1 assistant coach for this sport, who was male; the assistant coach was part-time.
- C. **Women's Cross Country:** There were 4 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$31,654. The head coach was male, and served as a full-time employee. Additionally, there was 1 assistant coach for this sport, who was male; the assistant coach was part-time.
- D. **Men's Golf:** There were 6 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$14,247. The head coach was male, and served as a part-time employee. There were zero assistant coaches for this sport.
- E. **Women's Golf:** There were 4 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$18,787. The head coach was male, and served as a part-time employee. There were zero assistant coaches for this sport.
- F. **Softball:** There were 20 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$51,072. The head coach was male, and served as a part-time employee. Additionally, there were 2 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 1 was male and 1 was female; both assistant coaches were part-time.
- G. **Men's Soccer:** There were 22 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$27,549. The head coach was male, and served as a part-time employee. Additionally, there were 2 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 2 were male; both were part-time.
- H. **Women's Soccer:** There were 19 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$39,762. The head coach was male, and served as a part-time employee. Additionally, there were 2 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 1 was male and 1 was female; both assistant coaches were part-time.
- I. **Men's Tennis:** There were 8 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$11,292. The head coach was male, and served as a part-time employee. There were zero assistant coaches for this sport.
- J. **Women's Tennis:** There were 7 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$11,262. The head coach was male, and served as a part-time employee. There were zero assistant coaches for this sport.
- K. **Men's Track and Field:** There were 39 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$40,479. The head coach was male, and served as a full-time employee. Additionally, there were 4 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 3 were male and 1 was female; all assistant coaches were part-time.
- L. **Women's Track and Field:** There were 18 participants on this team. The total operating expenses were \$41,818. The head coach was male, and served as a full-time employee. Additionally, there were 4 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 3 were male and 1 was female; all assistant coaches were part-time.

IV. Student Aid:

The college spent a total amount of \$125,373 on athletically related student aid, including the value of waivers. Of this amount, \$56,900 was spent on aid for men's teams and \$68,473 was spent on aid for women's teams. The ratio of athletically related aid awarded male athletes to that awarded female athletes was 74:67.

V. Recruiting:

The college spent a total amount of \$0 on recruiting. Of this amount, \$0 was spent on recruiting for men's teams and \$0 was spent on recruiting for women's teams.

VI. Salaries:

The average salary of head coaches for men's teams was \$11,877. The average salary of head coaches for women's teams was \$9,295. The average salary of assistant coaches for men's teams was \$2,278. The average salary of assistant coaches for women's teams was \$2,756.

VII. Revenues:

The amount of total revenues generated for all teams was \$838,914.

The amount of revenues generated for men's teams was \$234,714. Of this amount, the amount of revenues generated from football was \$0 (PVCC does not host football). The amount of revenues generated from men's basketball was \$0 (PVCC does not host men's basketball).

The amount of revenues generated for women's teams was \$215,581. Of this amount, the amount of revenues generated from women's basketball was \$0 (PVCC does not host women's basketball).
